## DECISION OF THE JOINT COMMITTEE OF THE CENTRAL EUROPEAN FREE TRADE AGREEMENT 2006

## No. 7/2024

## on the Establishment of an Electronic System to Facilitate Risk-management for Trade in Goods

Adopted on 9 October 2024

#### Preamble

#### **The Joint Committee**

Having regard to Articles 40.4 and 41.5 of Annex 1 to the Agreement on Amendment of and Accession to the Central European Free Trade Agreement (hereinafter referred to as "CEFTA 2006"), done in Bucharest on 19 December 2006;

Having regard to the CEFTA Parties' commitments under the CEFTA 2006 and its Additional Protocols, in particular to exchange data by means of electronic instruments with the aim of a) strengthening and improving the quality of their risk analysis and the effectiveness of security-related controls; b) establishing a common framework for risk management, common risk criteria and common priority control areas for CEFTA at the regional level; and c) setting up an electronic system to implement risk-management among CEFTA Parties;

Taking into account the Ministerial Conclusions of 21 November 2014, which emphasise the importance of undertaking efforts aimed at deepening the implementation of the CEFTA Agreement and the CEFTA 2006;

Considering that the CEFTA Parties maintain an adequate level of professional secrecy and are mindful of the applicable provisions of data protection within the CEFTA Parties;

Considering the CEFTA Parties' desire to exchange relevant Customs Risk Profiles that are of common interest to the CEFTA Parties;

Taking into account that the World Customs Organization (WCO) recommends that a risk profile should contain a description of the risk area, an assessment of the risk, the counter-measures to be taken, an action date, the results, and an evaluation of the effectiveness of the action taken;

Considering that the exchange of data among the CEFTA Parties via the CEFTA Inspection Reports and the CEFTA Rapid Customs Alert Forms requires the establishment of interconnectivity between the existing Customs Risk Management Systems of the CEFTA Parties and their SEED nodes;

Acknowledging the importance of strengthening and improving the quality of Customs risk analysis by the CEFTA Parties;

Having regard to the *Decision of the Joint Committee No. 2/2021 on the provision of data by the CEFTA Parties to the CEFTA Secretariat*, adopted on 2 July 2021;

Acknowledging the importance of *Recommendation No. 1/2019 on a CEFTA Customs Risk Management Strategy*;

Has decided as follows:

#### Article 1

## Definitions

For the purposes of this Decision, the following definitions shall apply:

- (a) CEFTA Risk Profile (CRP) means a risk profile of relevance to the Parties.
- (b) Customs controls means specific acts performed by the Parties to ensure compliance with Customs regulations and other regulations governing the entry, exit, transit, movement, and storage of goods.
- (c) Data means any information, whether or not processed or analysed, and documents, reports, and other communications in any format, including electronic certified or authenticated copies thereof.
- (d) Economic operator means an entity that is involved in activities covered by Customs regulations in the course of its business activities.
- (e) Inspection Report means a report on a Customs inspection that is linked to a CEFTA Risk Profile.
- (f) Customs Action means the specific implementation of a CEFTA Risk Profile.
- (g) Parties means the CEFTA Parties.
- (h) **CEFTA Rapid Customs Alert** means the provision of information about occurring risks of relevance.
- (i) **CEFTA Rapid Customs Alert Form** means an online form used for the prompt and simplified exchange of data about occurring relevant risks.
- (j) Risk means the likelihood and the degree of impact of an event occurring with regard to the entry, exit, transit, movement, or end-use of goods and to the presence within a Party, which would:
  - prevent the correct application of CEFTA or Parties' measures;
  - compromise the financial interests of CEFTA as a whole and/or of individual Parties; or
  - pose a threat to the security and safety of a Party and its residents, to human, animal, or plant health, to the environment, or to consumers.
- (k) Risk Profile means one or a combination of indicators aimed at selecting certain consignments or passengers that require increased Customs attention.
- (I) **Risk management** means the systematic identification of risk, including through random checks, and the implementation of measures necessary for limiting risk exposure.
- (m) SEED means the system and platform for the Systematic Exchange of Electronic Data (SEED) and the SEED+.
- (n) SEED modules mean the functional modules of the SEED software.
- (o) SEED node means an infrastructure composed of one or more servers that are hosting all SEED modules in a single Party.

## Article 2

## Establishment of an electronic system to facilitate risk-management

This Decision lays down the data and procedures for the exchange of risk management information with regard to CEFTA Risk Profiles, CEFTA Inspection Reports, and CEFTA Rapid Customs Alerts.

## Article 3

## **CEFTA Risk Profiles**

- (1) Parties may agree on CEFTA Risk Profiles (hereinafter "CRP") of relevance to the Parties to strengthen and improve the quality of Customs risk analysis by the CEFTA Parties.
- (2) Once established, the CRP and other information and intelligence shall provide a basis for targeting, *inter alia*, potentially high-risk movements of consignments, means of transport, or passengers.
- (3) The dataset for the CRP shall be based on the template provided in Annex I to this Decision.
- (4) The CEFTA CRP module shall be an integrated part of the SEED system.
- (5) CRPs are to be distributed amongst SEED nodes.
- (6) The proposals for, objections to, and the agreed data of CRP shall be distributed among Parties' SEED nodes.

#### Article 4

#### **Exchange of data from Inspection Reports**

- (1) Parties participating in a CRP shall exchange the data from the Inspection Reports resulting from Customs controls applied in response to the CRP.
- (2) CEFTA Inspection Reports shall comprise the data elements provided in Annex II to this Decision.
- (3) The data shall be distributed through the SEED system among the relevant Parties' SEED nodes.

## Article 5

## **CEFTA Rapid Customs Alerts**

- (1) CEFTA Rapid Customs Alerts shall be issued on newly identified risks that may require immediate action by the Parties.
- (2) The CEFTA Rapid Customs Alert Form shall be used to promptly exchange data on newly identified risks that may require immediate action of the Parties.
- (3) The relevant data elements for the CEFTA Rapid Customs Alert Form shall be based on the template provided in Annex III to this Decision.
- (4) The data elements of the CEFTA Rapid Customs Alert Forms shall be an integral part of the SEED system.
- (5) The data shall be distributed through the SEED system among Parties' SEED nodes.

## Article 6

## Exchange of risk data

- (1) For the exchange of data covered by this Decision, Parties shall establish interconnectivity between the SEED nodes and the relevant Customs Systems to process the data within the SEED system.
- (2) The Party providing the data distributed amongst SEED nodes specified in this Decision shall remain the owner of those data. Data provided by a Party shall be treated as confidential and used solely for the purposes laid out in this Decision.
- (3) In the context of the implementation of this Decision and of the exchange of data, the Parties shall rely on *Standard Operating Procedures*, as endorsed by the CEFTA Sub-committee on Customs and Rules of Origin, and revised as needed.

# Article 7 Entry into force

This Decision shall enter into force on the date of its adoption.

Adopted in Belgrade, on 9 October 2024, in the presence of representatives of all CEFTA Parties.
